
The garage sale will be advertised in the Austin American Statesman and signs will be put out the day of the sale.

*Oak Wilt Alert:* only prune and paint oak trees when it is very hot or very cold, then prune and immediately paint (you can use latex spray paint). Avoid pruning between February and June when the beetles transmitting the fungus are most active.



### Projects / Updates

Oak wilt survey

If you have oak trees, now is the time of year to check for oak wilt. Watch the oak trees as their leaves bud. Oak wilt symptoms first appear in late spring or early summer. Leaves turn a dull, bronzed brown at the tips and along the outer margins, with a sharp line separating discolored from normal green tissue. Leaves discolor, wilt, and fall at the top of the tree first, and later at the tips of the lateral branches.

If you see any trees that match this description, contact one of the Association officers. The Association will soon contact the Texas Forest Service to conduct an overall survey of our neighborhood to look for signs of oak wilt.

### Neighborhood Notes

Lost a pet / found a pet?

If you lose or find a pet, the best way to let neighbors know are by posting the information on the Northwood Facebook page and/or the Yahoo discussion group. The Facebook page is public so anyone can join (and see posts); the Yahoo discussion group is limited to Northwood residents.

The Northwoodna.com web site has details on joining both groups.

If posting to the Yahoo group, be sure to attach photos to the email, rather than adding them to the group's photos section; only people with a Yahoo email account and access to the group can see them, and few know to look.

*Keep dogs on leash / carry a scoop*Many Northwood residents have four legs and

either walk with their owners or are in their front yards, sometimes without a lease. Besides being against leash laws, unleashed dogs can be a (perceived) danger to other people who are walking or running nearby Some neighbors have been chased by dogs while jogging, if only briefly, and that can be scary.

If you walk your dog or let it in your front yard, please keep it on a leash for safety. Also, when walking your dog, be sure to clean up after it (and deposit the waste in your own trash can). Your neighbors will thank you!

### Don't feed the deer (on Oak Creek)



### Home & Family Safety

Suspicious "need help" emails - spoofing or hacking?

Editor's note: about a month ago people on the discussion group received an email supposedly from me (northwoodna@yahoo.com) saying I was in the Philippines without money and needed help. I appreciate everyone who called and emailed to check on me. The next day I received a similar email from a friend outside Northwood who also has a yahoo address. Both were fake.



Nearly everyone with an email account has received messages, either from strangers (often in Nigeria) or supposedly from friends asking for help. Be suspi-

cious of these - would the person in question actually contact you, and do so through an email (which may not be well written)?

If people you email have received a suspicious email from you, either your email was hacked - someone was able to log on as you (they figured out your password) or your account was spoofed: the message appears to be from your account but is actually from someone else. A <u>pcworld.com</u> article has details on spoofing, as does <u>About.com</u>.

If you suspect someone actually knows your email password, be sure to check your financial and other important accounts that use that email as the forgot password email. The hacker could have the reset password emailed to the address, then they can reset the password and gain access to your accounts... and lock you out.

If you do change email addresses, consider a Gmail account (www. gmail.com). Gmail has an optional 2-step account validation: you can add a mobile or land line phone number to the account. When you (or someone) logs onto the account from a new computer, a text or voice code is sent

to the phone. That number must be keyed to complete access to the email account. &

#### Are Binkies bad for babies?

Tom Glass, professor of Forensic Sciences, Pathology and Dental Medicine at Oklahoma State
University, wondered if pacifiers pose a health
risk for babies. His team of researchers gathered
pacifiers from randomly chosen families. They
swiped the surface of the pacifiers in an agar
plate, then cut them up and tested the inside to
determine what was growing on the surface and
in the pores.

They couldn't believe the bacteria they found: strep, listeria, various strains of staph including the bacteria that causes pneumonia and the thrush-causing yeast. 40 different species of bacteria were isolated from 10 pacifiers. They also found mold species that cause respiratory distress, asthma-like symptoms. They also found bacteria that release poisons into the system. In short, "We have no idea what this was doing to the child's immune system or system in general."

The team was concerned that pacifiers provide a way for certain germs to infect and then re-infect babies. Often children have a little red ring around their lip; in these cases it's likely the pacifier was infected rather that being overused.

The type of organisms the study revealed, and the levels on the pacifiers, led the doctor to believe binkies could make babies sick. "Persistent or recurring ear infections, persistent or recurring colic, all of those are the kinds of organisms that we found in or on the pacifier," said Glass. "The baby's colicky. What do we do? We put the pacifier in, which is supposed to make the baby less colicky. But in reality, it is providing everything we need to make the colic persistent."



The study found 3 ways that parents typically clean the pacifier: dust it on their sleeve, clean it with a wet wipe or put it in the mother's mouth. Putting it in the mother's mouth may actually be the best way to clean the pacifier – for the first 6 months, the baby's immune system comes from the mother.

Bleaching the pacifier or putting it in the dishwasher or boiling can help, but the germs keep growing. After 2 weeks the germs have formed

a complex structure called a biofilm. It's rather impervious to chlorox, baking soda, to boiling. So at that point the safest thing to do is discard the pacifier.

The team at OSU Health Sciences Center went on to recommend new pacifiers at the following times:

- 1. First symptoms of illness
- 2. Once ill, after fever breaks
- 3. As soon as the child recovers

### Top Tips: When to Skip the ER



- Minor Accidents. Many urgent care centers are staffed by doctors supported by digital X-rays. Examples of a minor accident include: sprains or strains, puncture wounds, scrapes and cuts, and broken bones.
- Illnesses. Minor illnesses can pop up overnight, especially during the winter and spring seasons. With on-site lab equipment, urgent care physicians can quickly diagnose infections, colds and other illnesses. Examples of a minor illness include: coughs and sore throats, ear/eye infections, fever or flu-like symptoms, diarrhea and headaches.
- Flu Shots. Urgent care centers are an easy and convenient resource for flu shots. Walk-ins are welcome and no appointments are necessary for treatment or vaccines.

Additionally, while co-pays vary by insurance provider, urgent care patients can expect to pay \$35 to \$50, compared to typical ER co-pays of \$100 to \$200 or more. For those with high deductibles, the cost difference could be \$1,000 or more. Additionally, compared to the national average emergency room visit of more than four



hours, many urgent care visits last less than an hour.




