Watch for Oak Wilt

As winter turns to spring and trees begin to get their leaves, if you have any oak trees be sure to watch them closely. If their leaves do not seem to be budding and growing normally, that might indicate oak wilt. If you suspect oak wilt, contact one of the Association officers; a tree expert will be called to check the tree. More details and examples of infected leaves are available at the northwoodna.com web site, in the Newsletters, Special Interest Articles section.



with a fungicide to save the tree. Some species die fairly quickly after being infected; others can survive longer, which means the fungicide has a better chance of working.

Treating a tree may save that tree but does NOT stop the oak wilt fungus from traveling through the roots to nearby oak trees; digging a trench deep enough to cut the intertwined roots is the only way to do that – and is very expensive.

The Association may pay half of the cost of treatment, up to \$500, for eligible residents.

Eligibility requirements:

- Homeowner must be current on dues and any other obligations with the neighborhood association (NNA)
- Homeowner must use treatment specialist selected by the NNA
- Homeowner must pay his/her portion in full at the time services are rendered
- Homeowner must agree to all requirements, including cost-sharing provision ☺

Austin is the fastest growing city in the US and as our population and job growth continues, experts predict prices and home sales will continue increase in 2014. Builders are expected to start construction on 10,000+ homes in the coming year to meet the demand which shows no signs of slowing. November was the 30th straight month of sales volume increases according to the Austin Board of REALTORS and it looks to be another competitive year for the real estate market in Austin and Central Texas. ☞



Has your credit card been "Targeted"?

During the recent holiday shopping season, hackers stole millions of credit card numbers and personal information (names, phone numbers, physical and email addresses) from Target shoppers. If you shopped at Target during that time or if Target has your contact information, the possibilities for fraud are greatly increased. You may get a fake, official-looking or sounding phone call, email or letter from some institution that asks for your personal information and (for emails) directs you to click on a link. Don't follow their directions!

Rather, go directly to the source - hang up and call your bank or credit card company, mark the email as "phishing" and log on to your bank or credit card account as you normally would - without following any links. If the email appears to be from Target, go to Target.com/databreach; Target is posting all customer communications on that page. Or call them at 866-852-8680.

Be proactive: Call your bank or credit card company and let them know you shopped at Target and are at risk for fraud. Sign up for credit monitoring - and if Target gives you a year for

free, renew it. Some hackers may wait more than a year to use your information. Review any websites that keep your credit card; hackers might be able to bypass your password by knowing the last 4 digits of your payment card. ☞

2013 Northwood Home Sales

According to Realtor Barbara Hilliard, in 2013 there were 22 Northwood houses sold. The lowest sales price was \$180,000 for 1,336 sf, the highest was \$275,000 for 2,845 sf and the median was \$227,818. The average days on market was 35. The low and high price per square foot were \$82.60 and \$168.40.
